

How Do I Join ASB?

There are many ways you can be involved in ASB.

1. You can run for ASB office. Candidates running for ASB President or ASB Vice President are required to have previous GHS ASB experience, however all other ASB positions are open to any student body members that meet GPA, discipline, and attendance minimum requirements. All ASB elected positions require that IF ELECTED, you take ASB as a class during period 2 for your year-long term and perform your duties well. ASB elections are held in the spring for the following school year's offices. For information contact Ms. Hazlett in the ASB Room, room E257 or e-mail her at mhazlett@gusd.net

2. You can run for Class office. The winning President and Vice President for all classes are required to take the 2nd period ASB class during their one-year term and perform their duties well. The other elected class officers (Secretary, Director of Finance, and Director of Activities) must take the 3rd period ASB commissioners class and perform their duties well. Class office applications will be available in March, after the ASB elections. Check the school website or daily bulletin for announcements. Class positions will be President (GPA 3.5), Vice President (GPA 3.5), Secretary (GPA 3.0), Dir. of Finance (GPA 3.0), and Dir. of Activities/Publicity (GPA 3.0). Potential class officers must also have attended a minimum of 4 class council meetings. Class elections are held in the spring for the following school year's offices except for ninth graders who run the third week of school for that year's offices. 3. You can interview to be an ASB Commissioner. These positions require that you take the Period 3 ASB class during your one-year term, have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 and perform your duties well. ASB Commissioner Applications will be available in March after the Class elections.

4. If you do not have room in your schedule to take ASB as a class, everyone is always welcome to join in the weekly Class Council Meetings which occur on Tuesdays. For the Senior Class of 2008, meetings occur in Mr. Sherrick's room (J385), juniors are in Mrs. Lamb's room (J185), sophomores are in Mr. Bauman's room (B318), and freshmen in Mr. Funaro's room (E250). Everyone is always welcome to join at any time.

5. If you are an incoming 9th grader, ask your counselor to put you in the Freshman ASB class. This is a leadership class for you and it all starts here.
