**A.** 2 years of History (1 of American History  
and 1 of World History)  
**B.** 4 years of English (College Prep)  
**C.** 3 years of Math (Algebra 1, Geometry,  
Algebra 2 +) *4 recommended*  
**D.** 2 years of Science (Lab science: Biology  
and Chemistry +) *3 recommended*  
**E.** 2 years of Foreign Language (same  
language) *3 recommended*  
**F.** 1 year of Visual and Performing Arts  
**G.** 1 year of a College Preparatory Elective

**ALL COLLEGE REQUIRED COURSES MUST  
BE COMPLETED WITH A "C" GRADE OR  
BETTER!**

universities, you must notify each school.

## NCAA Eligibility Standards for Collegiate Athletes

**16 Core-Course Rules  
(Min 2.0 GPA)**

4 years of English (College Prep)  
3 years of Math (Algebra 1 or  
higher)  
2 years of natural/physical science  
(1 yr of lab science)  
1 year of additional English, Math,  
or natural/physical science.  
2 years of social science  
4 years of additional courses  
(from any core area, foreign  
language or non-doctrinal  
religion/philosophy)

- ☞ Maintain strong grades → "D" grades do not meet A-G requirements and a "C" can't be made up!
- ☞ Take challenging courses that satisfy the A-G college admission requirements.
