SENIORS:

Cal State LA Honors College: Is committed to admitting well-prepared and motivated students who are interested in actively participating in our intellectual, social, and community engagement programs. Scholarships are also available. We recommend that incoming Freshmen applicants have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.5 or higher and a minimum combined minimum score of 1100 on the Critical Reading and Math sections of the SAT, or a minimum composite ACT score of 26.

If you are applying to the Education Opportunity Program (EOP) at Cal State LA, you need to fill out the supplemental application. Just selecting “YES” on the application to the EOP question will not be enough. You should be back on csumentor.edu (out of the portal) and click the “APPLY” tab and the EOP application is at the bottom. You will return into the portal and will need to proceed from there. The EOP program is a great opportunity for you to gain additional guidance through EOP support services.
